Location and History

Walk through this charming neighborhood's countless cafes and boutiques to find a similarly quaint lodging. Saint Germain des Pres is a casual, bohemian section of Paris where it seems like anything goes. While the rates here are unnecessarily inflated at times, Paris is not exactly known for bargains with character.

Property Overview

This lovely inn is composed of three adjacent buildings lovingly restored and decorated with antiques and ceramics. Its Parisian storybook facade features flower box windows with old-fashioned shutters. A signature scent wafts between the buildings, which are separated by their original staircases. Guests enter the main lounge to find designer conversation seating

around a fireplace. Staffers speak solid English and provide a warm welcome.

Accommodations

Guest rooms are contemporary and chic, with bright pastel hues covering the walls and soft goods. Wallpaper and fabric choices vary between different rooms. Some have unique pieces like Japanese lamps or framed photographs from scenes around town. Cushioned headboards support oversized cushioned headboards with twistable reading lights. Thick duvets, high-backed chairs next to sofas and coffee tables, and coordinated drapery are standard in all. Air-conditioning is strong, but windows still open for fresh air. Classic rooms are the base level with varying views of either the street or courtyard. Superiors are only a bit larger, with Prestiges being the top category. Family rooms add sofa beds. Baths are bright and come with hotel-branded toiletries with bespoke fragrance.

Free wireless internet is available throughout the hotel. Several suites up the space ante, but the prized options have small furnished terraces. Extra living space and special furnishings from various designers mark these rooms. Views may not be especially exciting, but the interior design is worth noting.



Comparable Properties

There are plenty of options in the neighborhood, but the plush interiors of this new hotel are worthy of attention. If it is full, consider Hotel de Buci although Americans may be unnecessarily drawn to the nearby Holiday Inn known for its own solid quality offering.



Property Overview

This upper-midrange, family-run hotel brings Austrian efficiency to the trendy Left Bank. Impeccably maintained, this hotel with Viennese roots resides on busy Boulevard Raspail, a scenic sycamore-lined thoroughfare leading from St. Germain des Pres to the Assemblee Nationale on the Seine.

Its 7th-arrondissement location and trim yet trendy modern decor are huge selling points, and the free Wi-Fi and complimentary breakfasts underline the friendliness. (Note: Breakfast is usually only tucked into the rates when booking directly through the hotel.) Guests are treated to discounts from the hotel's food and beverage menu. This eight-story hotel is a solid choice for expense account travelers and shoppers; the neighborhood is lined with a wonderful array of boutiques and brasseries.

Entrance is under a curving glass awning that looks like an art-nouveau hood ornament. The spacious reception area has a large desk, vast street windows and a clubbish lounge area with sofas and club chairs. Service ebbs and flows, but security is ever-present. The hip lobby decor incorporates clean-lined furnishings with colorful soft goods; cool, angular lighting fixtures; and subdued flower arrangements. A built-in bookshelf hosts more photos than books but is still an attractive feature. The art-deco-influenced furnishings in the lounge are among the strongest French accents in the house. Rotating exhibitions show off regional flair; at inspection, framed vintage posters were hung around

the public areas.

A small business center includes free internet access, and complimentary wireless high-speed internet access is available throughout the lobby. Reception can loan out laptops upon request. Parking is in a nearby public lot for a fee.

Accommodations

Accommodations are trim and modern, with wood wainscot walls to go with the platform beds and built-in furnishings. Far from being the most attractive in town, they certainly fit what most are looking for, albeit with little fanfare. Desks feature cordless phones and tablets that control room and internet functions plus a row of international power outlets. The sherbet lime and brown colors enlivening the rooms seem to be Paris' colors du jour. Modern lamps and small flat-screen TVs illuminate the trendy quarters, and eclectic art covers the walls. Bedside power outlets are a fine modern addition as well as cushioned headboards for reading in bed.

Tiny, ceramic-tiled combination baths sparkle with light and marble and feature heated floors. Above-counter bowl sinks and generic toiletries are in all, although some of the metal accents look a bit industrial.

Least expensive (and alluring) are the cramped Classic (standard) rooms. Pricier rooms, including the Executive units favored by most repeat guests, have more space and similar amenities. For the price of a roomy Junior Suite, guests could have their pick of midrange category rooms in just about any hotel in the city. Still, the rooms hold good value for this location. A few rooms have Juliet balconies, and all have windows that open for fresh air. There are a couple rooms on the top floor with Eiffel Tower views, but the rest overlook the street or indoor courtyard. Many top-floor rooms have cathedral ceilings cutting into some of the space. Adjoining rooms are not available. Four rooms are wheelchair-accessible.



Room service is available from breakfast time until 10 pm. Small pets are permitted for a US\$36 daily surcharge. The entire hotel is smoke-free.

Advisor Notes

Public transportation is conveniently outside the door. While the rates appear steep, this hotel generates better value than any of the Melia hotels in the city, and the location is excellent. Alternatively, some might prefer to step it up a notch and try the Montalembert across the street for similar rates, superior dining and comparable service.



Property Overview

This hotel covers the larger part of an oversized 9th arrondissement block and projects an immense 1862 facade toward the Opera Garnier, a shrine to Phantom devotees.

This vast and varied institution, despite its commercial overtones, boasts some of the most palatial public areas in Paris. "Grand" sums up this palace of hospitality. On the flip side, in classic French fashion, guest rooms remain petite, and service runs the gamut from exceptional to exasperating.

The green awnings and sidewalk tables of the hotel's landmark Cafe de la Paix, where Hemingway penned parts of *The Sun Also Rises*, have epitomized romantic Paris for generations. It is as crowded today as it was in the 1930s. Unlike other hotel restaurants, this one fills up with tourists and locals given its location with views of the Opera House.

A porte cochere frames the entrance (mostly covered with scaffolding and a faux facade due to renovation work), and plenty of valets park cars in the hotel's 16 rather expensive spaces.

The lobby, larger than many hotel lounges, is a picture of classic grandeur with a sweeping reception-concierge counter. The open black-

and gold-trimmed staircase winds upward.

The lounge, graced by a grand piano and featuring potted trees, lies under an atrium ceiling and immense chandelier. Plenty of seats are available in the immense lobby lounge area, rendering more of an American look compared to the more intimate lounges of its competitors. The bar-lounge houses a counter with copious bottles, where guests often rest after shopping. (Galleries Lafayette is just one of hundreds of big-name stores in the neighborhood.)

A business center provides everything from internet-equipped computers to translation services. Guests are given free wireless internet access throughout their stay.

Accommodations

Wide hallways with sconces go past sprawling elevator lounges coated in mahogany and marble. The undersized classic rooms are a disappointment; only the deluxe and executive rooms have adequate dimensions. Most units accommodate two or three people.

Styling is Directoire, and colors run to cranberry and gold or more attractive blue and gold. The renovation work is altering the color palette and fabrics in rooms, but many of the furnishings are remaining the same. Regal is the theme, and the designers have done a good job of instilling an imperial vibe. The monogrammed pillows, urn lamps and museum lights on the gilt-framed lithographs add to the staid traditional look. Accent walls feature patterned wallpaper and pair well with the fabric tones. Swags drape the wide windows handsomely. Raised beds with plush linen-lined mattresses topped with throws invite guests to enjoy the luxury. The rich use of colors and fabric makes the small spaces elegant and appealing, and mahogany furnishings add to the warmth.



Baths run from small to medium and are done in beige marble; many feature plenty of natural light thanks to their unique windows. All have robes, slippers, deluxe toiletries and hair dryers, and some have separate showers.

Some rooms feature small balconies, and the quietest face toward the interior courtyard and lobby atrium ceiling. Junior Suites are divided into two categories: those with and those without opera views. Request preferences in advance. The Luxury Suites grab guests' attention with extravagant finishes, king beds draped in velvet, and more bawdy red hues than Moulin Rouge's second act. Still, they provide an ample backdrop for romance. Five presidential suites are in the corners facing the opera, but several rooms also get this same choice view. Lucky guests in high-floor units are often surprised to discover lovely views of the Eiffel Tower, but the Opera view rooms are among the most requested.



Recent renovations have upped the number of international power outlets and added USB ports. Ongoing work is subtle, but moving floor by floor to update facilities. At inspection, several rooms and facilities were closed for touchups, but nary a disturbance could be heard. Guests on the club floor have upgraded amenities and facilities, including a private meeting venue, sitting room and dining space, as well as access to a two-level lounge with numerous food presentations. Free upgrades for elite level members are not offered. Plans are in place to move the club lounge to the first floor in mid-2019, which will take away the Opera House view sadly, but instead allow more space for panoramic suite accommodations that will fetch

more cash. The last of the room renovations are not scheduled for completion until 2021.

Service is highly professional and Midwestern-friendly. The entire hotel is smoke-free, and wheelchair-accessible and connecting rooms are available. Room service operates at all hours.

Advisor Notes

This is a grand hotel in its public dimensions, but the accommodations are cramped. Le Grand is the chain's best, though the newer, more modern InterContinental Paris Avenue Marceau is a wonderful hotel for modernists.

Location, scale and service are dazzling, and rates are competitive in this area. Shoppers see this as the ultimate home base for the nearby bevy of department stores and boutiques. Renovation work seems to push rates higher due to limited inventory, but there is no disturbance inside rooms. Once work is complete by late 2019, this place will shine at its best once more.



Property Overview

On the Left Bank, just south of the Eiffel Tower in the 15th arrondissement, this is a favorite of business travelers (and oddly enough, flight crews). Pullman is Accor's corporate-focused brand with a penchant for hosting large-scale events and meetings.

Many of the rooms have direct views of the Eiffel Tower's famed girder construct, which takes on an almost religious quality at night. A 30-second stroll is all it takes for gawking tourists and inspired guests to reach the soaring monument. Most balconies on the front of the building are very close to it, which pumps up the value here for tourists, too.

This is a strong commercial offering, flat-lining some when it comes to service. However, lobby greeters are always cheerful. Decor is fun and flirty, done with considerable contemporary flair and bold wake-you-up art and color schemes. Independent travelers are common, but groups arriving on packaged rates do best, corralled into buffets and prepaid luncheons that subsidize the extravagant prices. Most checking into a tiny Standard room on the rack rate will not be pleased.

This 11-story rectangle sheathed in travertine marble and lined with cantilevered eaves and glass balconies presents a modern facade for Paris. (It was built in 1967.) It is an unabashed commercial address with exceptional meeting space, although the hotel's own organic

garden producing some of the vegetables and herbs on the restaurant's menu is an unexpected touch. The same goes for the hotel's food truck often seen outside serving the many passersby looking for something a bit more gourmet than a baguette with cheese.


The vast lobby soars upward with the impersonality of a Manhattan bank. Marble and glass are everywhere, and elevator entrances are sheathed in burnished brass. Doormen greet arrivals swiftly, and the concierge desk offers skilled assistance. Reception takes place at an open-plan table from laptops, much like an Andaz, although privacy seems minimal.

A business center with Wi-Fi and high-speed internet access is of additional help. The lobby features small booths with internet-equipped computers. Free Wi-Fi runs throughout the public areas and guest rooms. Pricey parking is US\$50, although no one needs a car thanks to proximity to the metro and most tourist and business needs.

Accommodations

Guest rooms all come with a subdued minimalism realized with pastel-gray and sky-blue hues, stone accent walls, stark lighting, streamlined angular seats and desks, and beautiful beds with padded headboards. Most of the rooms have two beds. There are a few with queen beds and many with king beds, all of which are platform models with pillow-top mattresses and twistable reading lights. The decor is delightfully airy and crisp, and the chaises longues by the window feature small laptop tables.

The hotel's climate-control system is staff-controlled, so expect a few hot and or cold days when arriving in the fall and spring seasons. All rooms stock smart phones that can be used to make international phone calls or access the internet free of charge. Flat-screen TVs are mounted to the walls, and desks feature plentiful power outlets within easy reach (just like the nightstands).



Small marble-tiled combination baths have white wall-hung counters and handheld showers positioned above the shallow tubs with built-in armrests. Other baths have glass shower stalls, including some with glass doors separating the room from the bathroom. All are fitted with hair dryers, C.O. Bigelow toiletries, fluffy towels and large mirrors.

Classic rooms sport double or paired single beds and are the smallest at around 250 sq ft. Best to book a larger Deluxe room with a king, or better yet, a Deluxe room with a balcony offering stunning views on the hotel's front side. Junior suites have a small sitting room and little furniture in the large bedroom. If price is no issue, the 1,200-sq-ft Penthouse Suite has an astonishing view of the tower from a private, beautifully furnished terrace aimed directly at the monument. Adjoining and handicapped rooms are available.

Room service runs 24 hours.

Advisor Notes

The hotel's look is in line with the tastes of modern travelers, and the hotel is right on top of the meteoric popularity of bold modern design in France.

Alternatives that skew away from the corporate set include the art-deco-inspired Hotel du Collectionneur Arc de Triomphe near the famous Champs-Elysees or the InterContinental Paris Avenue Marceau. Individuals in search of the standardization and roomy common space that only a full-service chain link can offer will do better at the Renaissance Le Parc Trocadero Paris, located just across the Seine.



Property Overview

Located around the corner from the superior Park Hyatt Paris-Vendome, this 9th-arrondissement hotel is discretely managed by Sofitel, competing with the commercially oriented but superior InterContinental Paris Le Grand Hotel and update-prone Millennium Hotel Paris Opera.

The rooms are larger than those at the InterContinental, but public areas are not as palatial despite the chandelier-bedecked entrance. Renovations at inspection are to be completed by late 2019, with rooms being redone as the hotel remains open.

Sentimentalists may find a strong attraction to this place, as it was a haunt of the Hemingway crowd, and it claims to be the site of the world's first movie showing by the Lumiere brothers, but its rich traditional patina was traded in for a contemporary look years ago. It also was

home to the prestigious Jockey Club back in 1863. These days, Sofitel manages the property, and its solid, upper-midrange standards work well for tourists and business travelers looking for a central location and larger than average-sized standardized accommodations.

The decor is artsy and eclectic, with a few formidable Erte-era threads woven into the mix. At inspection, renovation work was thoroughly underway with a makeshift lobby and only a fraction of elevators and rooms in the mix.

A business center with an internet access desk is in the lobby, and free wireless internet signals are available to guests. Valets handle parking for around US\$50 per night.

Accommodations

Guest rooms come in several sizes and suit generally modern tastes. Designer Tristan Auer is responsible for the remodel, adding cushioned headboards, molding, wainscoting, and fresh furnishings including MyBed pillowtop mattresses. New artwork by budding French artists will feature various abstract styles.

Baths have terrazzo floors, ceramic and wood surfaces, rose-gold faucets, robes, slippers, makeup mirrors, separate toilets, and double marble vanities stocked with Hermes toiletries. Most rooms take their inspiration from the theater, whether cinematic or operatic.

Superior rooms are fair-sized at 250 sq ft, while Luxury rooms are slightly larger and have more of an art-deco look. The Club-level rooms are the largest, and they come with bonuses, such as upgraded toiletries, Nespresso machines, complimentary breakfast and complimentary beverages in the minibar. The hotel emphasizes suites named after historical figures.

Four duplex apartments provide families and travelers arriving with an entourage the largest accommodations. The top pick is Napoleon III, with floor-to-ceiling windows, lavish period accoutrements and plenty of gilt.

Small pets are permitted for free. Smoking is not allowed indoors. Room service runs 24 hours. Desk service is good but ranges from friendly to brusque depending on occupancy level.



Advisor Notes

The hefty price tag is as much about the hotel's central location as it is about the service-oriented facilities. Tourists, small groups and shoppers will enjoy this solid, middle-of-the-pack property with exceptional access to public transportation. Be sure to request a renovated room as these are slowly growing in number as the property churns through its refurbishment.

Those in search of a bold, traditional hotel with an independent streak in the neighborhood should look into Hotel Vendome. But, once the renovation here is complete, this hotel will be a force to reckon with in the neighborhood. It will compete squarely with the Hotel du Louvre, which is now part of Hyatt's Unbound Collection.



Property Overview

Planted in a particularly stunning location at Rue de Rivoli in the 1st arrondissement, this hotel flanks the Tuileries on one side and faces the Place Vendome a block away.

Formerly the InterContinental Paris, the property remains a top contender for best classic catchall on the second tier. It continues to rank high among the palace hotels of Paris, but it falls short of the superior InterContinental Le Grand Hotel even while it is undergoing renovations of its own. This has always been a commercial magnet, attracting large conventions. A new investment group has acquired the hotel, but plans are in place to keep it as a Westin for at least for the foreseeable future.

Two huge, bronze candelabras wow arrivals at the entrance. Inside, the signature white tea aroma of Westin and impeccably dressed bellmen greet guests. The lovely main courtyard, complete with glass roof, marble water nymph, round pool and fountain, is ringed by a marble-laden and chandelier-drenched glass corridor that ushers guests to reception on one side and to the restaurant and bar on the other. The low-ceilinged lobby features pale, soft colors, including the rakish armchairs and sofas that congregate in numerous sitting areas. Guests check in at gold-framed reception counters, although lines are constant given the high room count.

Accommodations

Guest rooms and suites are done in muted colors, such as silky lavenders and regal burgundies, that bring the hallway's violet-hued look to the interiors. The rooms are eclectic in size and shape, blending the building's original fin de siècle decoration with a mix of modern and retro art-deco-inspired fittings. Beautiful lanterns dangling from the ceiling help illuminate photographs of the city lining the walls.

All rooms have Westin's familiar Heavenly Beds, featuring pillow-top mattresses, down blankets, triple sheeting, comforters and duvets, and lots of throw pillows. Rooms lack coffeemakers, but guests can order one cup from room service each morning for free. Instead, don your robe and head to the lobby where from midnight until 7 am, free coffee and tea are on offer.

Marble baths come with drenching showerheads and curved curtain rods (or glass stalls), as well as velour robes, slippers, backlit mirrors and white tea-scented aromatherapy toiletries. Some of the top-floor rooms have mansard roofs that lead into the bath, limiting shower space. The age of the building also means that water pressure is modest.

The best rooms offer views of the Tuileries, Louvre, and distant Arc de Triomphe and Eiffel Tower, but the majority face the interior courtyard and neighboring side streets. Even the larger Deluxe rooms are not privy to the best exposures; these all come with a surcharge for the vista. Proportions are generally spacious, and balconies facing south are the best bet. Outward-facing rooms on higher floors have cozy standup balconies set into the mansard roof, creating a quintessential Parisian experience. Corner units with views of the Louvre and Eiffel Tower are worth requesting. There are a few adjoining rooms.



Service is quick and friendly, and room service never stops. Soundproofing is excellent. Small dogs are allowed for free. Safety is a priority, with elevators accessible only by key-cards.

Notable Features

Guests can borrow New Balance athletic gear to use in the 24-hour multilevel gym. More so than the common areas, meeting facilities are dressed in luxurious Napoleon-era detail. They are the hotel's most grandiose rooms, nearly all of which rival the city's nearby chateau interiors. The hotel's 12 meeting rooms include an eye-popping ballroom in the Versailles style that can accommodate 1,000, and an exquisite reception area overlooking the interior garden. Be sure to take a peek inside them if they are empty as they are truly palatial. A dedicated business center charges for everything, but guests are afforded free wireless internet throughout. Valet parking is available for US\$39.

Advisor Notes

The location means Paris' top 10 sights are either a short stroll from the hotel or within sight. Public transportation, including a metro station, is within a 30-second walk from the front door. This has always been one of the top players on the second tier. Briefcases and suits predominate, but American tourists are not far behind.

Westin's contemporary spirit has updated this once regal palace. For die-hard traditionalists and Francophiles, there is always Le Meurice.
